An initiative does not have its own venue. Therefore, it seeks help from other initiatives or services nearby. They are allowed to use a school's playground for activities in the evenings and on weekends.

A vacant piece of land lies unused and will only be developed by the city council in a few years. Until then, a social-sportive initiative is allowed to temporarily use it as a sports field.

EXAMPLES OF BARRIERS
